Neighborly Good Deeds

As pointed out in many of our monthly newsletters, our neighborhood is filled with residents who look out for each other and help make our neighborhood an amazing place. We also have organizations in our neighborhood that also try to make life easier for folks who are struggling with things like homelessness, hunger, and addiction. This month we would like to point out a few of the good deeds done by neighborhood organizations.

Located on the edge of our neighborhood is a homeless shelter that provides housing for families. The Human Services Program provides a place for homeless families while they find permanent housing and get back on their feet. The Human Services Program operates an Intact Family Shelter with 27 available beds.

The Human Services Program also operates a "shop" called Second Chances in a storefront located on West Green. Second Chances provides free clothing and other necessities for families. Donations of items are also accepted in the alley behind the shelter.

The Westminster Church of the Brethren provides a weekly meal for the homeless and its congregation regularly works to support various charities that help the homeless and hungry around Westminster and the world.

The Church of the Brethren has been playing a helping role in our neighborhood for many years. In 1879, the Pipe Creek Church of the Brethren purchased an English Baptist church building on the current site at Bond Street and Park Place for its members who lived in Westminster. In 1885, Westminster became part of the Meadow Branch Church of the Brethren. The Westminster building was replaced with a larger one in 1932. The Westminster Church of the Brethren was incorporated as a separate congregation on April 7, 1937.

Once incorporated, George A.
Early became the first elder and A.
Stauffer Curry its first pastor. A
two story education building was
built in 1959.

Since the first brick was laid in 1869, the church on the corner of Bond Street and W. Green Street has been playing a vital role in our community. St. Paul's United Church of Christ has many programs that reach out into our community and the world to try to make things better for others. St. Paul's was initially established as part of the German Reformed Church in the United States. In 1934, the German Reformed Church, with roots stretching back to the 1700's in the mid-Atlantic region, merged with the German Evangelical Synod in North America, whose members settled largely in the Midwest in the 1800's, to form the Evangelical and Reformed Church. In 1957, the Evangelical and Reformed Church merged with the Congregational Christian Churches whose history includes the Pilgrims and the

earliest settlers of America. The result is the United Church of Christ which celebrated its 50th anniversary in June, 2007.

With Church of the Brethren, St. Paul's Church sponsors a meal for the hungry every week, and also allows local groups that are unaffiliated with St. Paul's to meet at or use their facilities such as

Alcoholics Anonymous, Al Anon, American Red Cross Blood Drives, A Meal and More (Thursday Community Lunch), and Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays (PFLAG).

Both pastor Marty and Lucy of St. Paul's call our neighborhood home, and pastor Glenn of Church of the Brethren lives nearby on Green St. of Christ, on the corner of Bond and Green Streets in Belle Grove Square.

Yard Sale May 14th

On May 14th, 2011 our neighborhood will be hosting its second annual front porch sale. We will run an ad in the newspaper and will put up signs to announce the event. The sale will start at 8 in the morning and end whenever you decide to call it a day - in the event of rain, the event will be May 21st.

It looks like this year our garage sale may turn into a gigantic garage sale that will feature our neighborhood and several neighborhoods around Historic Belle Grove Square. We are coordinating the sale so that neighbors on W. Green, Anchor Street, Westmoreland and others can all participate in a huge yard sale in our part of Westminster.

Free Mulch in Spring

On two different weekends the city of Westminster will be providing dumpsters of free mulch for the neighborhood to use to spiffy up the yards in Historic Belle Grove Square. On both the weekends of April 8 and April 15 we will have a container load of mulch delivered for the Historic Belle Grove Square neighborhood use. Each container

Road Work Update

The city of Westminster has notified neighborhood residents that roadway paving is scheduled to begin in April. The project is scheduled to start on April 4, 2011 and on street parking will be temporarily eliminated within the work zone. Cover Lane, Bond Street, Park Avenue, and Park Place are scheduled for an overlay of the roadway surface. (please note that unforeseen conditions and factors uncovered in the resurfacing may limit the amount of resurfacing completed this Spring). Neighborhood Crime Prevention

Spring is that time when many of us are busy running around working in our yards and making frequent trips to the store for gardening supplies. Spring is also that time of year that as temperatures start to rise, reports of neighborhood crime start to increase.

Our neighborhood has had several neighborhood association meetings in which neighborhood crime and crime prevention has been discussed. Sgt Keith Benfer has presented information about crime prevention and neighborhood watches. According to information on the City of Westminster's website, the effectiveness of law enforcement department's crime prevention efforts is enhanced by active participation on the part of citizens. By calling to report suspicious persons or activities, you not only aid the police you make the neighborhood a safer place to live.

Some people fail to call simply because they are not aware of activities that might be suspicious. Others may notice suspicious activity and hesitate to call for fear of being labeled a "noisy neighbor" or a "crank". Still others take it for granted that someone else has already called.

Call 911 or (410) 848-4646, immediately when you observe suspicious activity. Do not worry about "bothering" the police. Do not worry about being embarrassed if your suspicions prove unfounded. Think instead about what could happen if you do not act.

What you can watch for and information needed by the police to assist in making a criminal case:

A. Suspected drug violations:

Is there a lot of traffic in and out of a particular house?

- 1. Does the visitor(s) arrive empty handed and leave with some type of package after staying for a short period of time?
- 2. Does the visitor(s) arrive with some type of package and leave empty handed?
- 3. Does there appear to be someone acting as a lookout?
- 4. Are trips being made to and from a phone booth?
- 5. Are there rooms where the lights remain on all night, seven days a week?
- 6. Do vehicles pull up to a house and a person(s) meet them or do they go in the house for only a few minutes?

If you observe the suspicious activity listed above, there is a good

chance that it may be illegal drug activity. The following is a list of things that you may try to do to assist the police department:

- 1. Note the time and day of the majority of traffic. (ex. Thursday, between 9pm and 11pm)
- 2. Name(s) or nickname(s) of any of the visitor(s) you may recognize or overhear.
- 3. Make, model and most important the license plate number of any vehicle(s) that are seen visiting the residence as well as any vehicle(s) that belong to the occupants of the residence in question.
- 4. The exact address including apartment number or the floor level.
- 5. Any pattern that you may notice developing.

After reporting this information, don't be discouraged if you don't see immediate results. A lot of time it takes a week to several months to make a case depending on all of the circumstances and information available.

B. Suspected residential criminal violations:

- 1. Someone is looking into your neighbor's window(s).
- 2. A car, truck or van backed up to a door or parked in the driveway that you don't recognize.
- 3. A suspicious vehicle that slows and drives by a house or business several times.
- 4. Someone is seen in an apartment or house that is to be unoccupied due to someone on vacation or having moved out.

Be a good neighbor and report any

type of suspicious activity!

All suspected criminal violations should be reported immediately by calling the Westminster police department at 410-848-4646 or 911. When calling the Westminster police department crime and drug tips line 410-857-TIPS, you will receive a recording. At the end of the recorded message you may leave your message about a crime or drug violation(s). You may then elect to remain anonymous, or you may leave your name and phone number and someone will get back to you within several days. If you need immediate assistance, call 410-848-4646 where you will reach a police dispatcher.

You should never feel as though you are bothering the police. We would rather be called to investigate something suspicious and find nothing, rather than to receive a call later and find that someone became a victim of a crime that may have been prevented.

Remember: you are the eyes and ears for the police and the community. We need your help to keep our neighborhoods a safe place to live and work!
